The restaurant's intimate dining rooms are airy and inviting, yet ever evolving as consignment furniture, art and floral arrangements changed.

The **RowHouse** menu will change weekly, allowing chef Greg Fox, freedom to explore new foods, and guests to get things unexpected, and always delicious. Greg's style is American cuisine, simple and to the point, but jazzed up with fresh ingredients and turned on when they hit the plate.

Greg Fox began his restaurant career cooking and managing the bar at **Ted E. Bears** (formerly Theodores's, formerly the Fifth Street Cellar Bistro.) Moving to New York City after his 20th birthday, while "acting" he "worked" at some of New York's finest restaurants, and came to love food and wine. Life led him to Nashville, Tennessee, where several years in the Hotel Business found him the Food and Beverage Manager of the Historic Hermitage Hotel, and it's famed Capital Grille. Soon to follow, Greg and friend Sylvia Harrelson opened **Cibo-Euro Cafe & Catering Company**, followed by a coffee and wine bar named **Press**. Working hard together they became shining spots in the budding Nashville food scene, but Greg longed to return to his roots, his family (his one of five siblings) and his home town.

RowHouse is a new venture for Greg. He has moved across the country, scrubbed floors, washed dishes, dumped trash, bar tended, waited tables, made desserts, cooked, managed, and co-owned a place, but never on his own. Now back in Topeka, with help from his family and friends, Greg is at home at the RowHouse.
